# Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

# Ferragosto: August 15th

Otherwise known as Assumption Day, is a national holiday across Italy. On August 15th, Christian Italians honor the Assumption of the Virgin Mary in their own way. In Siena, they celebrate with the **Palio di Siena**. In Rome, with the **Grand Ball of Ferragosto**.

Across the city centre, a DJ plays a different genre of music in each main square. From classical to Reggaeton, diverse sounds echo around the capital.

The biggest of all August festivals in Italy, Ferragosto also sounds the starting bell for summer vacations.

# Palio di Siena

This horse race, held in honor of the Virgin Mary since medieval times, takes place twice a year. Each July 2nd and August 16th, the main square of Siena becomes a racetrack for horses in the colors of 10 of Siena's 16 neighborhoods. Jockeys ride bareback around fanshaped Piazza del Campo on a layer of dirt. The race only lasts 90 seconds.

# **Grand Ball of Ferragosto**

Roma comes alive for the Gran Ballo di Ferragosto, a city-wide party during which every street, square, and corner is dedicated to dancing. Imagine a big city party, in which every square, every street offers music you can dance to!



# **Recipe of the Month**

# **SWEET BREAD (PANDOLCE)**

Receipe from the Cinque Terre Cooking School in Monterosso, Italy

# Ingredients

- 4 cups flour
- 125gr sugar
- 125gr butter
- 1 egg + 2 yolks
- 50g raisins
- 50g candied fruits
- 50g pine nuts or almond
- Vanilla essence
- I small pocket of yeast
- A bit of Limoncino

# Directions

Make a mound with flour, place yeast and vanilla in mound. Make a well in center and add cold yolks and butter and kneed together. Kneed until dough is smooth, gradually add raisins, pine nuts and candied fruits. Choose your favorite form and place onto greased oven trays.

Pre-heat oven to 320 degrees and bake for about 1 hour.
